Biography

Anthony Lee is a member of the St. Regis Mohawk Tribe. He graduated from Cornell University with a concentration in American Indian studies, and later received his Juris Doctorate from Cornell Law School. During law school, he founded a community legal program in his home town that assisted urban Indians. After receiving his J.D, Anthony moved to Washington, D.C., where he worked as an Associate for the Smith Law Firm (that specializes in representing Indian Tribes and Pueblos) and as the case editor for the Native American Law Digest.

Anthony worked with the Mashantucket Pequot Tribal Nation/Foxwoods Resort Casino as in-house counsel for nearly five years, where he was responsible for providing legal advice on the day-to-day operation of the world's largest casino. Prior to joining the American Indian Law Center, Inc., he worked as the Deputy Tribal Attorney with the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

Anthony is admitted to practice law in New York, Connecticut and the Mashantucket Pequot Tribal Court. He is also a 1994 Pre-Law Summer Institute graduate.
