Ms. Francine M. Hatch (Isleta Pueblo) is the Senior Policy Analyst for the American Indian Law Center, Inc. She also serves as an associate justice for the Pueblo of Isleta Appellate Court. Hatch was appointed by Governor Bill Richardson as the Senior Policy Analyst for the New Mexico Indian Affairs Department and was instrumental in the passage of several key pieces of legislation benefitting tribes, including the NM State-Tribal Collaboration Act (2009) and permanent funding for the NM Tribal Infrastructure Fund (2010). Hatch received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Washington, and a Juris Doctorate from the University of New Mexico School of Law. She is a member of the State Bar of New Mexico.
