### The Cobell Scholarship Program

Administered by Indigenous Education, Inc. (IEI) through the Online Application and Student Information System (OASIS)

- Enrolled member of a US Federally-Recognized Tribe
  - Descendants not eligible
  - Preference not given to settlement class membership
  - State-recognized tribes not eligible at this time
  - Canadian First Nations not eligible, even if US citizens
- Degree-seeking
  - Vocational Certificate/Degree
  - Associate's Degree
  - Bachelor's Degree
  - Graduate and Professional degrees
  - Graduate Summer Research Fellowship
- GPA (minimum will vary by level)
  - ▶ Will be determined by IEI and the Cobell Board of Trustees based on applicant pool
  - Competitive scholarship higher GPA is always better



### The Cobell Scholarship Program

Administered by Indigenous Education, Inc. (IEI) through the Online Application and Student Information System (OASIS)

- Enrolled in a non-profit public or private institution
  - For-profit/proprietary institutions not eligible no exceptions
  - When in doubt, ask your institution
  - If your school is not listed in our drop-down, it is most likely not eligible. Please ask us.
  - Online programs through public and private non-profit institutions are eligible so long as other criteria are met.
- Must be a full-time student as determined by your school.
- FAFSA required Pell-eligibility not required
- Unmet need
  - Unmet need = Cost of attendance resources (loans not included)
  - Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is a contributing factor
  - Information provided by student in collaboration with the office of financial aid



# Application Tips

- Begin to apply early when the opportunity opens
  - Don't wait for the deadline
- Complete the general application profile
- Opportunity match: available scholarships
- Ask questions early for best help

### WRITING TIPS: copy all question prompts into a Word document

- Carefully read the prompts, consider the reviewer and answer the question.
  - Write drafts in a word document first then paste into application.
  - Provide additional, relevant, compelling information.
  - Be clear, concise and organize your thoughts.
- Grammar counts
- Edits can be made until the deadline
- Oasis supplies help text, and frequently asked questions
- IEI webinars and videos are linked on the website and at the bottom of the oasis screen

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AND ADVICE

- SUBMITTING REFERENCES: referrals receive a link, get their email address
  - undergraduate references submit via the online questionnaire
  - Graduate references upload a letter into oasis
  - Vocational references are not required
- **S**TUDENT APPLICATION complete all sections
- Uploading files
  - OASIS UPLOADS: PDFS AND JPEGS (not links)
  - File names –jsmithtranscript.pdf, jsmithpic.jpg, jsmithclassschedule.pdf
    - No punctuation in the file name)
  - SYSTEM COMMUNICATION only sources of communication
- USE AN EMAIL THAT YOU CAN CHECK OFTEN not your parents, not your school issued email as you may transfer and we cannot track you

### DO'S AND DON'TS

- Do ask questions
- Don't wait to apply
- Do read all instructions
- Do check status and emails often
- Do respond to reminders
  - Missing documents
  - Incomplete application or responses
  - Renewal for spring term
- Do contact IEI if there are any changes (update profile often)
- Do make additional comments if needed
- Don't ask if you can fax requested documents
